Know the Threats

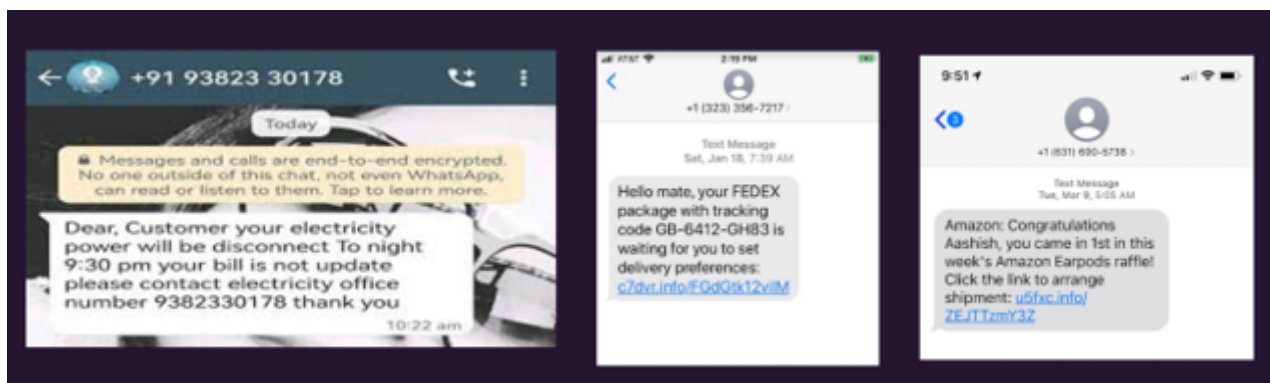
There are common tricks targeting young people.

- **Cyber Thugging:** Threats, blackmail, harassment for control.
- **Photo Trap:** Asking for pics, then misusing them.
- **Digital Pootprint:** Your online record can follow you.

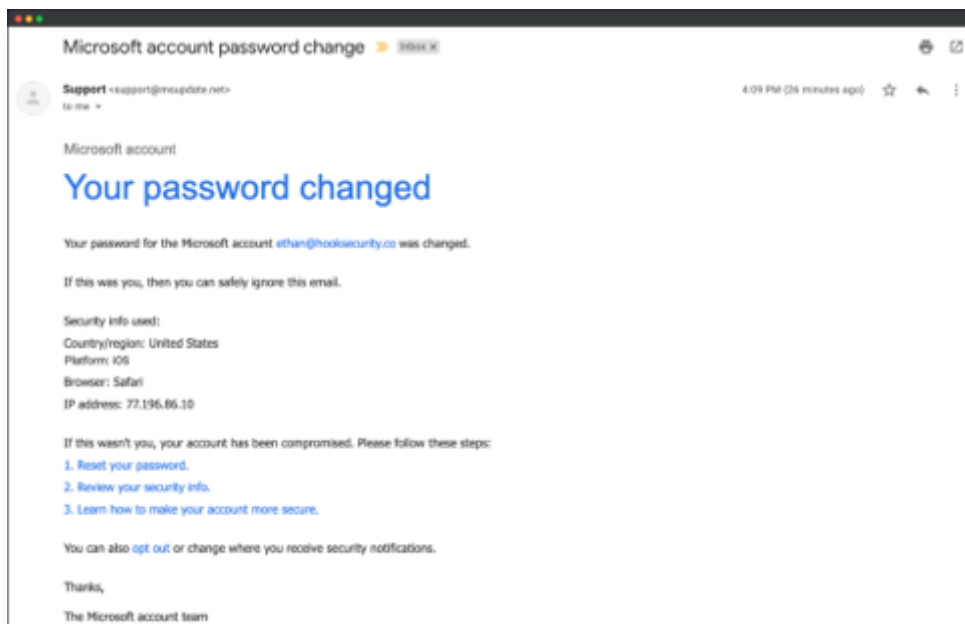
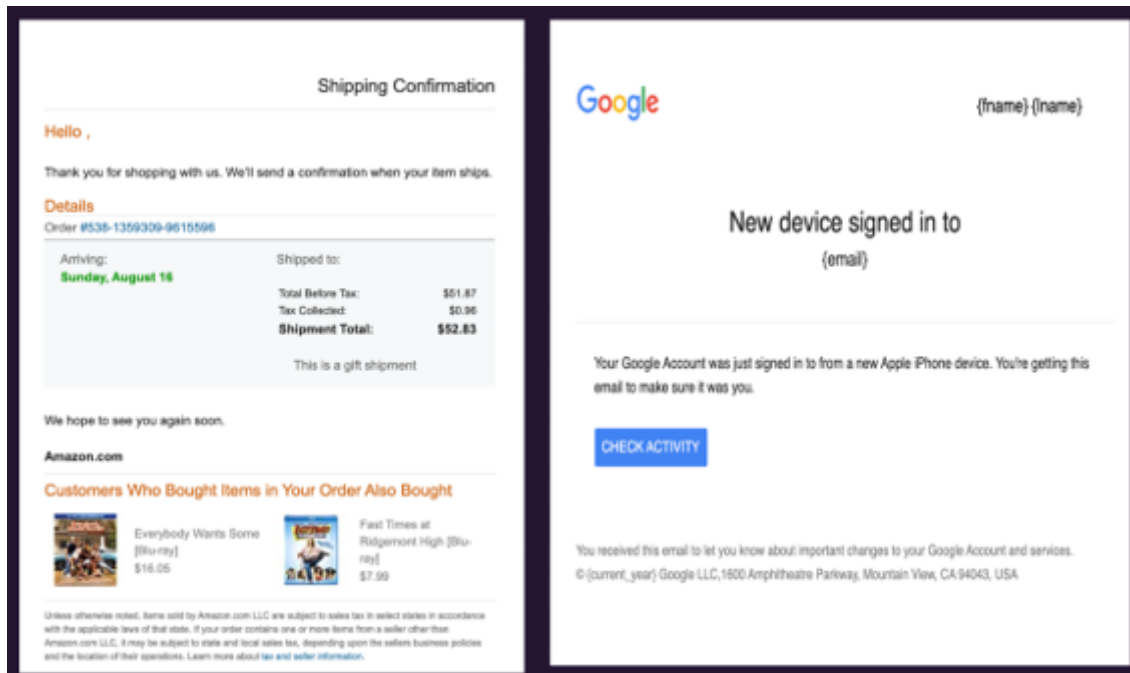
Fraud Part - 1

- **Financial Scam:** Double - your money, gift, lottery
- **Fake Police Message:** "Pay now or arrest" lies
- **Friend's Friend Request:** Impersonation via mutuats.
- **Job Offer Scam:** Upfront payment, fake HR emails.
- **Loan App Scam:** Hidden fees, forced access, threats.

There are a few simple steps you can take to avoid falling prey to a phishing scam.

- First, don't click on suspicious links in your email, especially those that ask for personal information. If you're not sure whether an email is legitimate, don't open it....and definitely don't click on its links.
- If possible, contact the company or organization directly through a known and trusted channel before responding to any emails asking for personal information. You can also file a complaint with Federal Trade Commission or other federal agencies.

- Finally, pay attention to the tone and content of the email. Is it unusually urgent? Are there misspelled words? Is there an offer that seems too good to be true? If it seems "Phishy", it probably is.

Cyber Fraud & Cyber Thugging

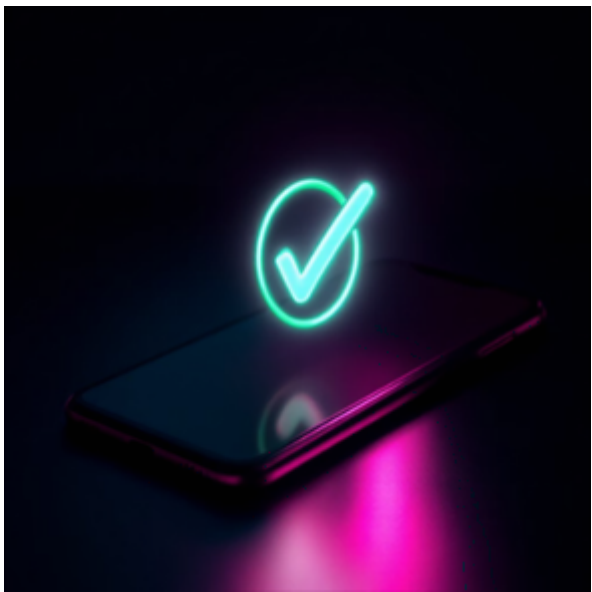
Red Flag🚩: Requests for gift cards, lottery, or sudden "verification" links.

- Scammers pose as friends, officials, or brands.
- They pressure with insults, threats, or urgency for money.

Golden Rules

1. **Never share Personal Details:** ID,Phone, Address, School/Work informations - Keep private.
2. **Think Before Sharing:** OTP, Aadhar Pan and Account Details.
3. **Don't Click Unknown Links:** Ignore random DMs and "Urgent" link requests.
